



20-kg Tumour Removed in Lucknow

What Happened

Doctors at Balrampur Hospital successfully removed a 20-kg abdominal tumour from a 45-year-old woman from Faizabad. The massive tumour had been pressing on her internal organs and causing severe abdominal discomfort.
