Sare Disease Care in Assam

Designation as Centre of Excellence (CoE):
 The Assam Medical College & Hospital (AMCH), Dibrugarh, has been officially designated as a Centre of Excellence (CoE) for Rare Diseases under the National Policy for Rare Diseases (NPRD).

• Regional Significance:

- This is the first CoE in Assam and the second in the entire Northeast region.
- Nationwide, there are now 15 Centres of Excellence, making AMCH part of a select network.
- The initiative is expected to bridge healthcare gaps in one of the most underserved regions for rare disease management.

Patient Care & Facilities:

- The CoE will provide advanced diagnostic facilities, specialized clinical care, and multidisciplinary treatment options.
- It will serve as a referral hub for complex cases from across Assam, Arunachal Pradesh, Nagaland, Manipur, and Meghalaya.
- Access to financial support under NPRD will be streamlined for patients registered with the centre.

• Policy & Support:

- The NPRD emphasizes early diagnosis, genetic counseling, and financial assistance.
- AMCH will now coordinate with the Centre's digital patient registry to track rare disease cases and outcomes.
- Collaboration with patient groups and NGOs is planned to improve awareness and reduce delays in treatment.

• Impact:

- India has an estimated 70–96 million rare disease patients, with more than
 450 identified rare disorders.
- Until now, patients in Assam had to travel to far-off metros like Delhi,
 Bengaluru, or Kolkata for advanced care.
- This CoE will reduce travel burden, lower treatment costs, and bring hope to families struggling with rare conditions.
